The Board met on five occasions during the school year.

The Board on the recommendation from school agreed to set up a new DEIS plan to run from September 2017 to June 2020 and focus on the key areas of Numeracy. Literacy, Attendance and Parental Involvement. The Board also sanctioned an extra member of staff to the Maths Recovery team.

The Board sanctioned an online system for reporting bullying incidents. There is a blue button on the school website www.scoilbhrideshantalla.ie that generates a reporting tool once clicked giving members of the school community an opportunity to report on line and there is a dedicated chain of command within school to process these reports.

As support to out Music curriculum the Board agreed continued funding for the 'Colour Strings' programme.

The Attendance strategy for the school was revised during the year. The school has two important programmes that are essential for improved Attendance and these are 'Every day Counts initiative and our 'In the line for ten to nine' strategy punctuality strategy..

An amendment was made to our Code of behaviour clarifying the parents rights to appeal suspensions and expulsions

A major Health and Safety audit was undertaken by external professionals and a new Health and safety document has been prepared and adopted by the Board..

A copy of the staff Allocation for the 2017-2018 school year and the class allocation for 2018-2019 school year are included in Appendix 1 of this document.

The Board of Management and Staff have identified a huge weakness in the development of Irish in the school. The school will concentrate on developing a realistic programme of Irish provision over the next three years. Irish is now a major part of our School Self Evaluation programme.

The Board were involved with 5 major Department of Education Initiatives this year:

- The introduction of the Oral language Programme
- The new NCSE model for Special Education Teaching
- The Revised Child Protection Guidelines.
- The compliance with GDPR
- The re-engagement with SSE.

The School Meals Programme was run for the school year.v

2. School Development:

We introduced the new Primary Language Curriculum in Infants to 2nd classes, with its introduction of Oral Language from 3rd to 6th Classes planned for September.

Literacy 2017-2018: Along with all our other Literacy initiatives this year saw a very exciting development in terms of literacy in Scoil Bhride. In line with world-wide best practice, we have decided to cease teaching formal reading to our Junior Infant children. The time formerly spent on reading will now be spent on an expanded programme of Reading Readiness activities and on Oral Language. This will insure that the children are much better prepared for when reading instruction begins in Senior Infants.

The focus for Numeracy in the past year was the Measure Strand.of the Maths Curriculum. The emphasis this year focused on practical work in the classroom and emphasis on the children as active learners. Also another teacher was identified for Maths Recovery Training tand will be part of the Numeracy support team for next year.. Project Maths students from NUI Galway observed Numeracy classes and then supported the children around maths in the school's Homework clubs. The focus for 2018-2019 will be on Maths language.

The HSCL Coordinator was available throughout the school year to meet parents in school, in their homes and assist them avail of family, personal and educational supports. A number of free courses were made available to parents in the area of well-being (fitness class, yoga, mindfulness, couch to 5km, nutrition) and new skills were learnt in classes provided in English, Cooking, First Aid and Make-Up.

Parents were invited to talks on Art Therapy, Connecting Emotionally with your Child and Internet Safety. They were also involved in the literacy based programme 'Doodle families' and the 'One book, One Galway' project

Coffee mornings were held for the parents before talks/courses, after their child's Christmas show and for the junior infants open day. Parents engaged in International day by setting up stalls and being active participants in the show.

SPHE: The school operated the revised guidelines in full this year.

3. Parent Teacher Meetings

Parent Teacher Meetings took place as usual in November 2018 and school reports were completed for all children in school in the last term. Standardised testing was completed in Spelling, Literacy and Numeracy.

4. School Buildings:

The Health and Safety audit identified some serious concerns with our building structures. The Temporary Accommodation prefabricated buildings at the rear of the school can no longer be used. These will now be taken out of commission as the report deemed them unsafe. There is also an issue in the main building with mould developing in some rooms. The Department have been forwarded copies of the audit and the recommendations for immediate action. Our

engineer has forwarded the relevant professional documentation to the DES as well and has outlined the plan of action that needs to be put in place. The lack of room space will have implications in the next school year. The Department have yet to respond to us in relation to the issues raised. Further action will follow based on Departmental advice.

5. Finance

The school has a major problem with Finance at present. There is no local contribution coming from our school community so outside Department grants the school relies on fundraising initiatives. Most of these are run by the Parents Association and involve cake sales which fund specific events. This impacts greatly on the school. The Board of Management have put steps in place to try and create a more transparent and efficient system in place. An accountant has now been appointed by the Board to review, manage and report to the Board with a view to seeing where savings can be made and to increase the funding available to programmes in the school. Major fundraising events will have to take place in the next school year to supplement the funding from DES grants. The school books have been sent to the Auditors to bring our accounts completely up to date.

6. School Staffing:

We lost one school position for the 2017-2018 school year and have retained the same number of staff for the 2018-2019. A list of the staff is included in Appendix 1. The two most senior teachers in the school are retiring. Ms. Mulgannon and Ms. Divilly (Lavin) will both retire at the end of the current year. This will leave a significant gap in the management team as Ger was Deputy Principal and Mary was an Assistant Principal 1. The loss is significant as while Ger will be replaced as Deputy Principal Mary's position will not be filled as we no longer meet the criteria under the DES Circular for this position. There will be a wealth of experience lost to the school and pressure on the ISMT to fill duties that Mary had in her portfolio. There will also be changes to the ISMT next year as all posts will now be reviewed in light of the pending appointment of a new Deputy Principal.

The school received the Trinity College 21st Century School of Distinction Award and the school also became one of 15 Ashoka Changemaker schools in Ireland The school also received a FÍS award for its filmmaking programme. Our school is a Digital School of Distinction. Senior Classes attended NUI Galway for Graduation ceremony for UNI4U. The School Band are Galway and Connacht Ceoltas marching band champions for a second year in a row in .

9. Agency Involvement

The school has been working with the following agencies —EWO, SCP, NEPS, CAMHS, NYP/WFS, NUI Access Office, NUI Service Learning Department, CFES Trinity College Access Office ,CYPSC and the HSE Social Work Department this year The involvement has included work in relation to Attendance, Behaviour, Mentoring Strategies to support for our children in a variety of different ways, funding for In-school and After School projects. It also included identifying a target list for SCP personnel in our school.

10. Professional Development for Teachers

Staff received one more day of training in the Revised Language Curriculum.

All staff completed Child Protection Training in March 2018.

Staff completed Fire Safety Training in April & May 2018.

Ms. McGrath completed the Diploma in Special Education in NUI Galway.

Ms. Moran and Mr. ferguson completed a post graduate in 21 Century teaching and Learning in Trinity College.

11. Conferences:

Frank attended the Ashoka Changemaker Conference in Lyon, France.

12. School Celebrations

The school celebrated Presentation Day with our sister school in Newcastle rd. in November.
